



LWCF Reimbursement & Grant Close Requirements

INCLUDE 1-4 IN ALL REIMBURSEMENT REQUESTS

- 1. Tabulation of Reimbursable Costs form
- 2. Billing Request form
- 3. Invoices for each expense/payment made
- 4. Cancelled checks (front & back) or proof of ACH/wire payment

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR CERTAIN SITUATIONS:

If **CONTRACTOR(S)** used, also include:

- Tabulation of all submitted bids (follow city/county policy or bids required for costs over \$25,000)
- o Details of chosen bid (bid documents submitted by chosen contractor)
- Copy of signed contract
- Change orders, if any

If VOLUNTEERS worked on the project, include a volunteer sheet with each volunteer's:

- Name
- Signature
- Dates worked on project

If **DONATIONS** were made to the project, include an invoice from each donor with a balance of zero. Donations of land require proof land has been transferred to city/county, such as a Quit Claim Deed and/or Settlement Statement.

If CITY EMPLOYEE(S) did non-administrative work on the project, include proof of:

- Employment
- o Rate of Pay
- Time worked on project (timesheet)
- o Amount paid for project work

Be sure to speak with Antoinette Norfleet, DNR Grants Manager, about using employee time as match.

FINAL REIMBURSEMENT REQUEST & CLOSEOUT PROCESS

For **FINAL** reimbursement request, include documents listed above and:

- Boundary map, IF not previously submitted
- <u>Limitation of use/affidavit</u>, IF not previously submitted. Must be submitted/recorded with city/county
 office that maintains public property documents.
- Proof LWCF sign has been purchased & installed in park (submit invoice & cancelled check for sign)
- o NOTE: 10% of award held until NPS notifies DNR that grant may be closed.

For *final* reimbursement to be made and grant closed:

- LWCF must conduct a final inspection of project site once *all* work completed.
- O DNR submits closeout documents to National Park Service & requests to close grant. This process can take several months.
- Once NPS approval is given to close grant, DNR's Grants Compliance Specialist will schedule a review with grantee. After review completed, the remaining eligible funds will be released.
