The following action was taken at the Board of Natural Resources meeting on December 2, 2025.

The Board approved the minutes of the board meeting on October 28, 2025.

The Board approved the proposed Rule 391-5-13-.04 Vince Dooley Battlefield Trust Fund Program.

The Board adopted the Resolution to approve the Proposed Amendments to the Saltwater Fishing Regulations, Rule 391-2-4-.04.

The Board approved the Coastal Marshland Protection and Shore Protection Committee membership.

The Board adopted the Resolution to approve the Proposed Amendments to the Rules for Inspection and Maintenance, Chapter 391-3-20.

The Board adopted the Resolution to approve the Proposed Amendments to the Rules for Radioactive Materials, Chapter 391-3-17.

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The Board adopted the Resolution to authorize the Commissioner to seek State Properties Commission approval to acquire (purchase) $3,856 \pm$ acres from Union Carbide Corporation, the property known as the Mocama tract, Ceylon WMA, Camden County.
