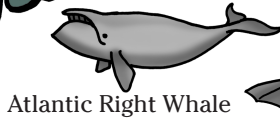

Atlantic Right Whale



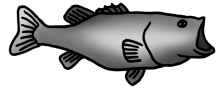
Bats

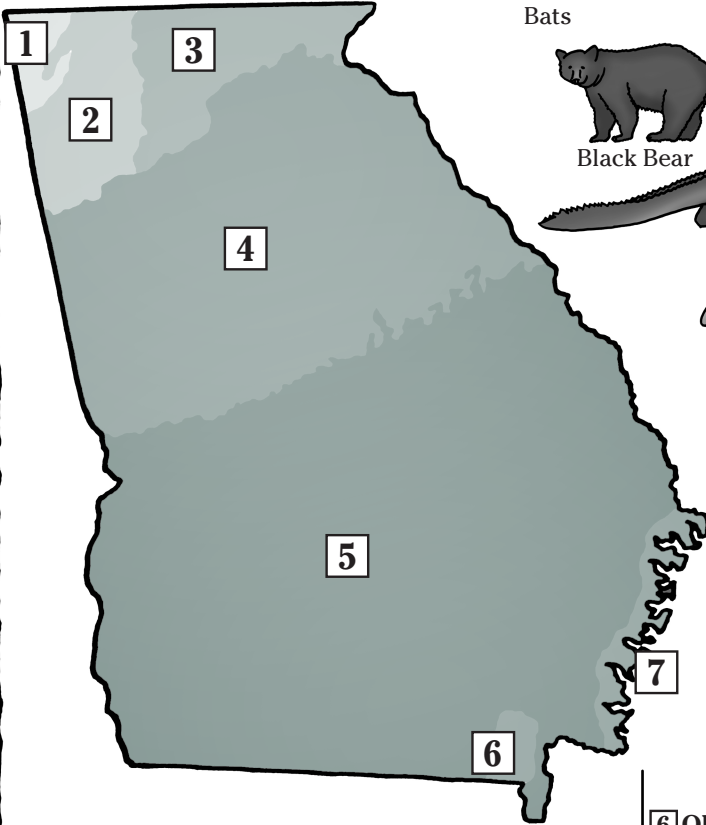

Draw a line from each animal to the best region/habitat from the description below.



1 Cumberland Plateau:

With a maze of caves, some animals 'hang' here.

2 Ridge & Valley:

Lots of different freshwater animals make their homes in this region.

3 Blue Ridge: Georgia's biggest land mammal 'sleeps' here.

4 Piedmont: Scientists say that millions of years of erosion here created waterfalls and river rapids, where amphibians could live.

5 Coastal Plain: This area was a sea floor millions of years ago, so the ground is not "rock hard". This makes it easier for animals to burrow.

6 Okefenokee Swamp:

Did you know that peat is rotting dead plants? This peat bog contains 70 islands and lots of wildlife.

7 Atlantic Coast:

Underwater ridges rise as high as 6 feet off the sea floor. Coral and sponges are found here in this perfect habitat for marine life.
