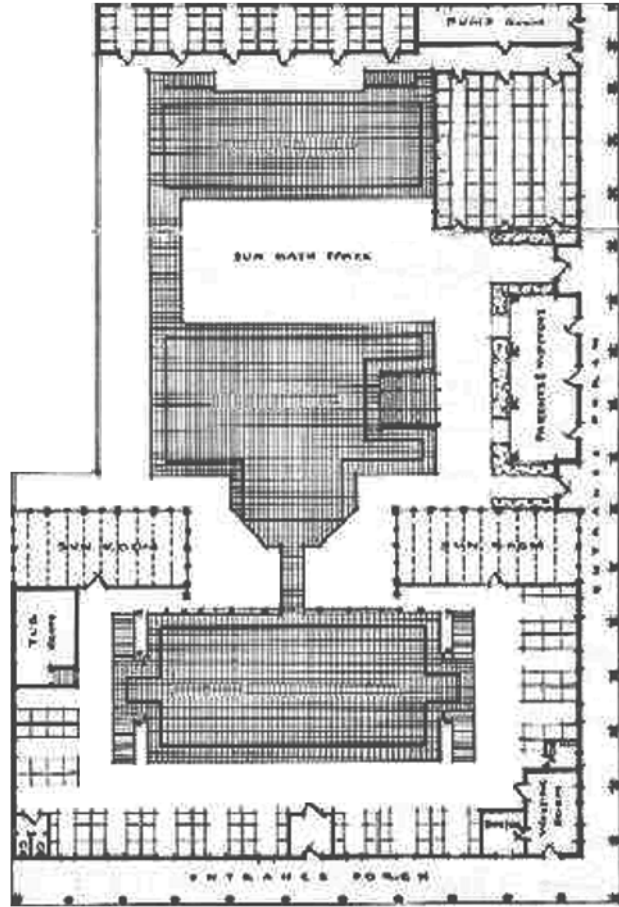


## Roosevelt's Little White House: A Scavenger Hunt Through History
