Requirements for Schools Wishing to Become Certified District NASP Tournament Hosts

Rules/Requirements:

- 1) Schools that desire to host official District NASP events must be certified. Certification may be obtained by attending a District NASP host's training workshop.
- 2) Schools wishing to host a tournament must have at least 2 years of tournament participation experience.
- 3) Applications to conduct a District NASP tournament must be submitted to your Regional Hunting and Shooting Education Specialist for approval by **September 30, 2020**.
- District NASP tournaments will be posted on the <u>https://nasptournaments.org</u> by the hosting school.
- 5) District NASP tournaments will follow all NASP rules.
- 6) The NASP PRO Tournament Listing with Online Registration and NASP PRO Scoring program must be used when hosting a District NASP tournament.
- 7) A District NASP event must have two or more schools participate in order to be classified as an official Georgia District NASP tournament.
- 8) The results of a district tournament must be published using the NASP Pro scoring system as well as submitted to the regional Hunting and Shooting Education Specialist, using the 2020 District Host School Report Form, within two days of completion of the district tournament.
- 9) All volunteers that assist with the planning and conducting of a District NASP tournament must complete and submit a NASP Instructor time sheet to their Regional Specialist.
- 10) All volunteers acting as lane officials must be trained using the NASP "Lane Official Training" video. Link: <u>https://www.naspschools.org/resources/learning-center</u>
- 11) In order to conduct a district tournament that is representative of the regional qualifier and state championship, the hosts should: (1) operate a bow check station, (2) adhere to NASP time limits and (3) use the announcer's script that is provided by the Hunter Development Program.
